Report Ten Forty Matrix meeting 1 November 2008

Business

Finances: we have \$3344.87 in our account.

Hire of Summer Hill is \$67.50 but is about to be increased.

Topic for discussion:

What community and support networks increase our sense of wellbeing?

We divided into three groups by numbering ourselves off around the room. This gave three very diverse groups. Each chose their reporter.

Ideas and suggestions discussed:

Holidays

Successful holidays and weekends have been organised by a few women during the past year. Examples were holidays at Lord Howe Island and in Vietnam, and weekends visiting Canberra for Floriade and the Art Galleries. Some of the best fun was going out to dinner and socialising in the evenings.

Retiring Women

Members of this group organise lots of lunches and events, eg going to the opera together. It is not just for retired lesbians, but for anyone who wants to participate.

Book Groups

Anyone can start a book group by announcing it at a 10/40 meeting or advertising it via contact@olderdykes.org. Open book groups are organised by the Women's Library and Feminist Bookshop.

Choirs

Some women have formed their own choir or joined one, and have found it a great way to meet other women.

Bush walks and bike rides

Those organised by older lesbians, while requiring a degree of fitness, suit women in their 50's and 60's. To get on the Women in the Bush contact email list, email contact@olderdykes.org

Other social support networks ranged from the gym to playing bridge to the work place. Each of these have a common theme of a shared activity creating regular social contact. In a friendly group this often leads to further social contact outside the specific activity.

Some activities that some felt were not so enjoyable were a dance class that was not age appropriate and being new and no one greeting you.

There were a number of suggestions for improving meetings at 10/40.

We should consider the acoustics. Women with hearing difficulties have trouble with the echoes from hard surfaces in the room. Closing off half the room when there's a small group would fix this problem. We could also set up the room cabaret style with small groups seated around tables - more friendly than perching in a big
